Overview

In 2001, Communities In Schools (CIS) developed the Communities In Schools Leadership Institute, formerly known as the FutureForce Leadership Institute (FFLI). The Leadership Institute allows hundreds of high school students from across the state of Georgia to experience college life during a week of leadership and recreational activities. The Institute is designed to build skills and expose students to people and experiences that will help them develop and execute a plan for future success. Students participate in skill-building workshops led by trained educators and community leaders. There is a focus on leadership areas not traditionally covered in high school curriculums. Following the Institute, the participants are able to use their experiences to help them achieve success in the classroom and in their community.

Program Details

When:

Monday, June 4 - Friday, June 8, 2007.

Where:

Emory University in Atlanta.

Students stay in traditional university housing with common showers/restrooms on each floor. Apartment style housing is available for staff and chaperones. Three meals per day are served in the university cafeterias and food court. Students will also have the opportunity to be exposed to the unique culture of the city of Atlanta.

Who:

The Communities In Schools Leadership Institute is open to high school students (**grades 9-12**) from across the state of Georgia. Students are chaperoned at all times by CIS staff members.

Cost:

\$325 for students, \$325 for chaperones. Cost includes lodging, cafeteria meals, workshops and parking.
